In order to be considered a viable candidate, the following must be met:

Qualifications

- You must be a student enrolled at Wayne State in academic year 2010-2011 and free from academic or disciplinary sanctions
- You must have at least a 2.5 grade point average and maintain this throughout the program
- You must demonstrate leadership or leadership potential
- You must possess an interest in affecting change in the Detroit region
- You must be able to attend monthly Leadership Wayne Sessions, held on Saturdays from 9am-1pm.

Expectations

- You will be flexible, self-motivated, cooperative, and active in session discussion
- You will ask for help when needed, and be willing to address any concerns or challenges with Leadership Wayne programming staff
- You will challenge yourself and others
- You will complete all assignments and readings prior to Leadership Wayne sessions, if assigned
- You will dress professionally for each session
- You will interact with others in a professional, politically correct manner
- You will come prepared to each session with the necessary materials and/or items
- You will arrive to each session and be seated fifteen minutes prior to the beginning of each session
- You will not miss more than two sessions

1. A Leadership Wayne Online Application. The online application is a PDF document and includes several short answer questions.

2. Three letters of recommendation that describes your academic ability, leadership qualities and/or experiences, as well as an evaluation of your motivation and commitment for the Leadership Wayne program. Ideally, your references will speak knowledgeably about your demonstration and potential for leadership development. We strongly recommend that you use academic references, choosing references with whom you have a formal relationship. Personal references are discouraged. To ensure that your application submits electronically, please also save the PDF application to your computer, and email it as an attachment to ac2913@wayne.edu to Dr. Barton, with the subject line: "Leadership Wayne Class II Application".
